Changing Faces

Health professionals are all too aware of the devastating psychological consequences of facial disfigurement, and that practical help for patients is often lacking once they leave hospital. Changing Faces is a new charity set up to provide a specially tailored programme of workshops in social skills for facially disfigured people. The workshops are led by James Partridge, director of Changing Faces—who was himself badly burned in a car accident twenty years ago—and a combination of other professional counsellors. Participants are encouraged to learn and practise effective verbal and non-verbal skills to combat self-consciousness and help those they meet to perceive the personality behind the disfigurement.
